GENERAL ELECTION INFORMATION

Port Commissioner Elections

General elections are held on the first Saturday in May of each odd numbered year, as authorized by state law and the enabling legislation for the Port of Beaumont Navigation District of Jefferson County, Texas (the "District"). The Director of Administration is the Election Officer (the "Election Officer") for the District and is responsible for conducting District elections as prescribed by the Election Code of the State of Texas.

The Port of Beaumont Board of Commissioners is composed of six members who serve six-year terms. Four of those commissioners represent geographical areas within the District's taxing boundaries, and two are elected at-large, representing the entire District. Commissioners for Ward 2 and one at-large position will be next elected in 2025. Commissioners for Ward 1 and Ward 3 will be elected in 2027, and Commissioners for Ward 4 and one at-large position will be elected in 2029.

- May 3, 2025
 - Ward 2 and one At-Large position

Candidate Information

Qualifications

Port of Beaumont Commissioners, in addition to having such other qualifications as prescribed by law, shall be a qualified voter of the District and shall own real property in the District. Candidates must live in the ward in which he or she is filing to represent.

Filing Information

The first day to file for a place on the 2025 ballot is Wednesday, January 15, 2025. The final date to file is 5 p.m. Friday, February 14, 2025. The Election Officer will accept applications at the Port of Beaumont's Administration Office, located at 1225 Main Street, Beaumont, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. There is no filing fee.

Texas Election Law is very specific in many areas and the linked material below contains information and forms for the General Election. We would caution you, however, that the responsibility for compliance with the Election Laws and the Finance Filing Guide for Local Candidates and Officeholders belongs solely to the candidate. The Texas Ethics Commission is responsible for interpreting Campaign Finance Law (Title 15).  - In accordance with Texas Law, you must designate a Campaign Treasurer before any funds can be expended and before candidate accepts campaign contributions. You may name yourself as treasurer. These forms are to be filed with the Election Officer.
- <u>Code of Fair Campaign Practices</u> [PDF] Your subscription to this Code is voluntary, but we encourage candidates to file this form with the Election Officer.
- Once you have filed your application, you will utilize the following forms during the campaign.

These forms are to be filed with the Election Officer on dates specified on the form. There is a modified reporting statement for those candidates not planning to spend more than \$500.00. Candidates are encouraged to pay close attention to their expense forms. Per Texas Law, these forms are considered public record.

- C/OH Report: Designation of Final Report (Included at the end of Form C/OH) This form is to be filed at the end of the election or when you are no longer receiving or spending political contributions

- <u>Title 15</u> of the Texas Election Code by the Texas Ethics Commission. This information pertains to the filing requirements of campaign expenditure reports. Title 15 also contains regulations on political advertising.

The above forms are filed with the Election Officer, and as such, the District serves only as the custodian of the records for the benefit and convenience of the public. The Election Officer does not have any duty to determine the sufficiency or timeliness of the statements and does not have the authority to refuse to accept a statement for filing on either of these grounds.
